

SILVER AWARD PROJECT


As part of her Girls Scout Silver Award Project, Mason Middle School student Veronica Preston committed her time and energy to fundraising and coordinating a project to install menstrual supply dispensers, stocked with free products, in district bathrooms.

She started her projects in 2020 by spearheading a community fundraiser for emergency period packs that contained free products for students that started their period unexpectedly at school. In 2021, when she was in 6th grade, she presented another idea to have a shelf in Student Services to provide the emergency packs and coordinated another community fundraiser to pay for the shelf and free products which are now available in the Student Services office.

In 2022, she asked the district to supply feminine hygiene product machines in all district bathrooms and was on-hand when dispensers were installed in middle school bathrooms in September.

"I'm happy that I have been able, with the help of my school, to have the products that students need available where they need them," said Preston. "I hope this project continues to help students and my community for a long time."

The organization Girls Helping Girls Period www.girlshelpinggirlsperiod.org provided statistics and information that were instrumental to Preston as she presented her ideas and requests to district leaders.



Those who would like to support the emergency period product project in Student Services can do so by donating the items below at Mason Middle School.

- Ipsy bags (or similar small pouches or bags)
- Various sizes girls' underwear
- Teen pads and tampons
- Black leggings
- Feminine hygiene wipes

In addition, the community can help by educating their students on proper use and disposal of products to ensure the products are available for their intended purpose.
