SUPERINTENDENT GOALS 2016-17

The superintendent's goals for 2016-17 will be incorporated into the evaluation tool. The goals provide guidance to the Superintendent throughout the year.

SUPERINTENDENT EVALUATION TOOL

The State of Michigan is mandating each Board of Education use one of two superintendent evaluation tools. The evaluation tool selected by the Board of Education must be posted on the website and Board of Education members must receive training.

Superintendent Drzewicki provided a Bulletin Board document describing the evaluation process. The two evaluation tools identified by the State are the School Advance Framework and the Reeves Model. MASB's evaluation tool has yet to be approved by the State of Michigan. Superintendent Drzewicki prefers to use the School Advance tool as it is the same tool used to evaluate administrators.

The evaluation process was discussed at the ISD's Superintendent's Round Table. Ingham ISD will provide training on all models.
