Equity Project Updates

Mason Middle School

Ted Berryhill and Mary Hilker presented on the middle school and the updates that they are making to Tier One instruction. They discussed some of the barriers of economically disadvantaged students and ways to break them down.

The middle school also has a School-Based Leadership Team that allows teachers to collaborate and take on the responsibility of leading projects. Ted pointed out the importance of measuring effectiveness and making continual improvements to these initiatives.

Mason High School

Lance Delbridge presented on the high school and the updates that they are making to classroom instruction. He explained that if there is a big need for an accommodation building-wide, it is beneficial to imbed it into all of their classes, rather than only writing it into individual 504 plans.

The high school is utilizing the last 15 minutes of staff meetings to individually read a professional development article and then have a table discussion on it. Lance also has a goal to have every MHS teacher present at a staff meeting this year.
