Reports/Discussion

Director of Student Supports

Craig Kueffner asked attendees to share celebrations from Inclusion Week. Several were shared. Teachers appreciated that the material was clearly planned and laid out for them. There were positive reviews about the selected books and the conversations they started. Members of the committee noted that they visited the buildings and witnessed kids engaged and saw a lot of positive things. Parents, staff and students appreciated that the events were district wide.

Craig presented the results from the Inclusion Week Feedback Survey. The feedback provided data on student and staff levels of interest in the activities, participation, enjoyment level and their favorite day.

Diversity Subcommittee Reports

Community Involvement

With inclusion week taking the place of the Mason Moves Forward Event, the sub-committee spent time discussing other ways to achieve community involvement. One idea is a multi-media contest.

Instructional Practices and Resources

The sub-committee spent much of their time debriefing from inclusion week. Discussion items included adding a culminating activity at the end, possibly a district wide culminating event. They also had an idea for the entire DEI Committee to have a theme for each meeting (belonging, inclusion, etc.) to focus on.

District Procedures

The sub-committee had a conversation about developing communications to parents and the community. They consider questions such as: How will we do it? What are the obstacles? What are the things that kids may have interest in if they knew about it or knew that scholarship funds are available. One idea is to hang up signs with QR codes around the building that offer information or ask questions allowing students/staff an opportunity to provide suggestions and feedback.

Craig shared that the district is using an INSIGHTeX survey to gather information and help us grow in equity as a staff.
