

Scholarship Application Form

The Mason Optimist Club is a service organization consisting of men and women of the Mason area who work very hard for the benefit of the youth in our community. Some of the Mason Optimist activities include:

- Donation of \$20,000+ in scholarships to graduating Mason High School seniors in 2024
- Contributing and volunteering to the Weekend Survival Kits program for elementary children in need. The program provides food to get families through the weekend
- Sponsoring Mason High School and Middle School "closet" programs (Mason Optimist Closet) which provides needed essentials for students and their families without cost
- Supporting Project RED 500+ student event for Greater Lansing
- Spearheading the major Skate Park development for all kids to enjoy
- Conducting the Christmas Toy Drive (Chuck and Islia Brandell) each year for area kids
- Sponsoring area youth sport teams
- Conducting an annual Youth Appreciation Event for middle and high school students
- Providing orchestral, band, yearbook and robotics support
- Sponsoring/conducting the annual Youth Sports Event at Burchfield Park (typically 300 plus children in attendance)
- Working the "kettle" for the Salvation Army
- Scholarship donation to an FFA student
- Scholarship to a Wilson Talent Center (Career Center) graduate
- Conducting Spring and Fall highway cleanup
- Serving meals at the Thursday Night Live concert events
- Fundraising efforts in order to do the above activities

In addition, Mason Optimist Club is involved in a number of fundraisers in order to fund the scholarships you are applying for. Hopefully, someday you too will be in a position to give back to your community.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Mason Optimist Club is awarding scholarships in 2025 (up to \$2500 individually) to Mason high school graduating seniors who have been accepted to a <u>college</u> (2 or 4-year) or <u>trade school</u>, who have demonstrated <u>good citizenship</u>, a <u>strong work ethic</u>, and <u>have financial need</u>. To be considered for this award, each applicant must:

- Complete this entire information application.
- Include a copy of his/her high school transcript.
- Include 2 signed letters of recommendation from an adult, non-family member.
- Include a copy of the <u>first page only</u> of your FAFSA showing the EFC (Expected Family Contribution) **and** Student Aid letter from your chosen college/trade school (if available).
- Potentially participate in an interview (this will be reserved for the top few candidates).
